
Editor's Note:

John 20:11–18 (NRSV)

11 But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; 12 and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. 13 They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." 14 When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. 15 Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." 16 Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). 17 Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." 18 Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.

As we conclude the Season of **Lent** and renew our Walk and our Witness to the Lord's work in our lives...Let the same elation and excitement voiced by Mary Magdalene be part of our message and Story of how Christ has redeemed us and is ALIVE in our Lives...

Imagine for a moment that you are in Mary's place... She saw Him Crucified, she saw His Lifeless body laid in a tomb. What hope can she have other than to prepare His body with spices and herbs as was the traditional process of burial and grief. She wants to care for His Body and pay her respects for the one who healed and saved and yet was rejected and murdered so cruelly.

How many of us have had our hopes dashed by some unforeseen event? That missed promotion that goes to someone else after it was promised to you. How many have had promising relationships, that held great promise of Love and affection, only to be betrayed by the very person you were counting on when you see them start up another relationship with another ... right in front of you, or behind your back.

Jesus was the hope of many to cast down the rule of Rome and lift up a New Jewish Kingdom in the fashion of King David, and Earthly power and Kingdom.

Jesus rejected that idea and stayed true to the purpose that The Father had for Him. He had even told them the Father's will for Him...

John 6:37-40 (NRSV)

³⁷ Everything that the Father gives me will come to me, and anyone who comes to me I will never drive away; ³⁸ for I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will, but the will of him who sent me. ³⁹ And this is the will of him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that he has given me, but raise it up on the last day. ⁴⁰ This is indeed the will of my Father, that all who see the Son and believe in him may have eternal life; and I will raise them up on the last day."

Jesus was about His Father's business even if he would be killed for it.

It should not be surprising that Mary Didn't understand what had occurred and was weeping because she had come to find the Body of Jesus yet found an empty tomb. And she was weeping and distraught.

How many times have we had some catastrophe come from out of the blue and dash our plans, our hopes?

Just as Losing Jesus in this horrible way on Golgotha and now even his body is missing and Mary can't even find that small piece of lament and sorrow for her grief. She cries out for some small glimmer of hope for honoring the body of Jesus. The two angels ask her why she is weeping... Have they no idea of the cruelty that had transpired just last Friday, three short days before???

Her anguished reply to their question... "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him."

Then

how that it was Jesus. ¹⁵ Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." ¹⁶ Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). ¹⁷ Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'" ¹⁸ Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.

Beyond all Hope there behind her is Her Lord, even though she doesn't recognize Him...When He speaks to her though..."Mary" instantly she knows He is there ... Teacher!!! And Then Jesus tells her that He hasn't ascended to the Father yet but that she should go and tell His brothers, the Disciples, and to give them a message....'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'

Can you imagine how quickly the return trip to the disciples went? Mary Literally flew over the path and through the streets to where the disciples were... Breathless, I imagine she gives witness to what she has just seen and heard. It is impossible.... Yet still it is true .. she saw Jesus and She Heard Jesus and He commanded her to go Tell the Disciples 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'

Still breathless I can hear her bear witness "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.

We may NOT have had the same experience as Mary that morning at the tomb. Yet we Believe and because we believe that Jesus is Risen from the DEAD we CAN have the same fervor and passion of Mary and We can join Her Cry...."I have seen the Lord" with our own affirmation of Faith... He is risen... He is Risen Indeed!

God's Love for us, even though we are sinners and enemies to God, brought Christ to die for US. God does the work required for our reconciliation to Him through the Son, Jesus Christ.

Know that you are reconciled to God.

Praise be to our Lord Jesus the Christ!

We are reconciled to God through Christ and our Faith in Him.

As we walk in the world **physically** following the Footsteps of Christ, others will see you and what you do. Let all you do give Glory to the Father above.

We continue to lift up the health concerns of our Church family as well as life events and even the routine daily events of our Community around us.

We must continue to pray for all the World and local agencies that work to improve the lives of those devastated by storms and other natural disasters. Pray for the international organizations flooding aid and resources to these devastated areas and help minimize the loss of life.
