As often as I've read this passage I see the process for putting into action the portion of the Lord's Prayer that covers "Forgive us OUR trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." We are to forgive others as God forgives us -- plain and forthright.

The process of bringing witnesses and involving the Church in the process should occur only in very rare cases. We as Christians should be able to handle our differences between us as individuals.

Jesus affirms to us again the authority He gives to all Christians. He also affirms that we should seek counsel and support from one another, or several in our faith community, when we pray about a need or a circumstance that concerns us and others and for world situations and circumstances. We can and SHOULD pray fervently and faithfully for "God's will to be done, on Earth as it is in Heaven."

God is here among us when we pray and as we pray. What a powerful promise.

Remember from the Sunday, August 27, service: Christ has a **PASSION** (Love) for us, a **Plan** for us and a **PROMISE** to us.

Passion: John 13:34–35 (NRSV) ³⁴ I give you a new commandment, that you **love one another. Just as I have loved** you, you also should love one another. ³⁵ By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have **love for one another**."

Plan: John 6:38–39 (NRSV) ³⁸ for I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will, but the will of him who sent me. ³⁹ And this is the will of him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that he has given me, but raise it up on the last day.

Promise: Matthew 28:18–20 (NRSV)¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. **And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."**

Jesus lets us know <u>His expectations</u> and <u>His anticipation</u> for us in His Passion, His Plan and His Promise that He has made to us in the above scriptures and others.

God sent Jesus to save us. In order for that to happen WE need to be convinced to have FAITH in HIM.

Jesus **creates** a new frame of reference for **expectations and anticipations** for all of us, not just the people 2,000 years ago.... **God's power is limitless and beyond our expectations.**

Healing, feeding, teaching, comforting...with Jesus this is only the beginning, He draws us into the family of God, makes us HIS children, the children of God, and SAVES us from SIN and DEATH.

Again, let me remind you.... Each of you is a member of the body, an integral part of the church and God's perfect plan of salvation. You may not realize right now at this moment how integral **ALL** the individuals are in **His ministries**. We may not all have the same gifts but

we are all blessed with some for the Common Good to Glorify God.

Christ is Risen...Christ is Risen Indeed!

We are reconciled to God through Christ and our Faith in Him.

As we walk in the world **physically** following the footsteps of Christ, others will see us and what we do.

Use your Gifts of the Spirit to give Glory to the Father above.

I don't recall anyone wishing me a "Happy Labor Day" or sending me a **Labor Day** card. We don't give corsages, decorate the house, or give **Labor Day** gifts. Even the florists and greeting card manufacturers haven't found a way to capitalize on it. Of course, it's a boon to resorts and tourist centers and a bad weekend for the Church because everyone wants to travel.

Like most things, **Labor Day** is different things to different people. To the factory or office worker, it may be a day off. But, for mothers who have both Dad and the kids to deal with, it's a tough day. For policemen, who must deal with extra heavy traffic and alcohol abuse, it's a tough day. To farmers and ranchers, it's just another day to feed the cattle and work in the field doing things that allow no holiday.

For Christians it is an opportunity to talk about work and its rewards. Work is a very important part of God's revelation and will for people. God has always honored and provided work. God is a worker Himself and appreciates rest as he tells us in Genesis.

2:2. He created us in His image and gave us work to do. "For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." Even from the beginning, God gave men work to do, Genesis. 2:15.When Jesus came to earth, God honored work: He announced His birth to

working shepherds. Jesus Himself learned a trade and worked with His hands. Jesus chose working men as s His apostles and called them from their labors to His side. Jesus preached His message to the working class and common people.

So you see we do carry our Christian principles into the work world, our work becomes a Christian ministry. This gives work new meaning and dignity.

We can't, on the other hand, claim to be Christians if our Christianity is only a one day a week affair. God does care what you do Monday through Friday whether you are an employee or employer. There is great encouragement in knowing this.


