### [Matthew 22:15-22 \(NRSV\)](#)

*15 Then the Pharisees went and plotted to entrap him in what he said. 16 So they sent their disciples to him, along with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that you are since teacher, and teach the way of God in accordance with truth, and show deference to no one; for you do not regard people with partiality. 17 Tell us, then, what you think. Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor, or not?" 18 But Jesus, aware of their malice, said, "Why are you putting me to the test, you hypocrites? 19 Show me the coin used for the tax." And they brought him a denarius. 20 Then he said to them, "Whose head is this, and whose title?" 21 They answered, "The emperor's." 22 Then he said to them, "Give therefore to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God the things that are God's." 22 When they heard this, they were amazed; and they left him and went away.*

This **October 2023** will be a very important month in the life of Clarksbury Church.

Your leadership and you as a congregation have made a decision to be faithful to the **traditional** interpretation /understanding of the scriptures... not to be negative, rather to be positive.

We as a Church have determined, as guided by the scriptures, to continue to render **to God the things that are God's**...to serve God as the **scriptures**, our **Wesleyan tradition**, our **Christian experience**, and our understanding and **reason** call us to.

On October 7, 2023, starting at 8:30 a.m. at an **Annual Conference Session via Zoom** there will be a vote to ratify **YOUR** decision to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church. **Pray for the will of God to be made known in this vote. Amen**

Much **work, legal and otherwise**, will follow after the decision of that meeting.

**Clarksbury** will continue to be welcoming, loving, and faithful to our community. We will continue to love our neighbors; we will comfort the sick and the poor; we will serve our community with peace, love and mercy; and we will honor the sacraments as prescribed in scriptures.

What are your **expectations and anticipations** for this October and the future ahead?

I urge all of us to pray for our nation; for safety in returning to school and peaceful activities in all of our communities.

As often as I've read this passage, I see the process for putting into action the priorities and distinctions for our Christian lives. We render to God that which is God's...plain and forthright.

God is here among us **when we pray** and **as we pray**. What a powerful **Promise**.

I will state again from last month because it is very important to **FOCUS** on God, not his fallen world.

Remember: Christ has a **Passion** (Love) for us; he has a **Plan** for us; and a **Promise** to us.

**Passion:** John 13:34–35 (NRSV)

<sup>34</sup> I give you a new commandment, that you **love one another. Just as I have loved** you, you also should love one another. <sup>35</sup> By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have **love for one another.**

**Plan:** John 6:38–39 (NRSV)

<sup>38</sup> for I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will, but the will of him who sent me. <sup>39</sup> **And this is the will of him who sent me that I should lose nothing of all that he has given me, but raise it up on the last day.**

**Promise:** Matthew 28:18–20 (NRSV)<sup>18</sup> And Jesus came and said to them, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup> Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. **And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.”**

Jesus lets us know **His *expectation* and His *anticipation*** for us in His Passion, His Plan and His Promise that He has made to us in the above scriptures and others.

**God sent Jesus to save us; in order to do that WE needed to be convinced to have FAITH in HIM.**

Jesus **creates** a new frame of reference for **expectations and anticipations** for of all of us--not just the people two thousand years ago...**God’s power is limitless and beyond our expectations.**

Healing, feeding, teaching, comforting...with Jesus this is only the beginning, He draws us into the family of God, makes us HIS children, and SAVES us from SIN AND DEATH.

You may not realize right now at this moment how integral **ALL of you are to His ministries.** We may not all have the same gifts but we all are blessed with some for the Common Good to Glorify God.

As we walk in the world **physically** following the footsteps of Christ, others will see us and what we do.

## LAY LEADER — WARREN WRIGHT      Stewardship, God's economic plan

I want to tell you about God's economic plan. In **1 Timothy 6:17-19**, is a passage that may explain God's economic plan better than any other.

"Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment.

"Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share. In this way they will lay up treasure for themselves as a firm foundation for the coming age, so that they may take hold of the life that is truly life."

One of the greatest mistakes, I think, that we make when we talk about money in the church is that we often do it in the context of a special appeal or in a crisis situation.

If we are told that there are thousands of starving people who need our help and a special offering is taken, if that strikes your fancy, you'll probably give and maybe even give sacrificially to help meet that need. Or if you are reminded that the church needs your gift for the building fund, and you feel that that's a legitimate need, then you will give generously in response to that need, too.

And the result is that too often Christian people have been conditioned to think that the only time they really need to get serious about giving is when there is a need that appeals to their particular emotion. And some needs are just more appealing than others, aren't they?

But the problem actually starts with us, with people who don't recognize that **the teaching of Scripture is not to give to needs but to give to the glory of God**. We are stewards of God's wealth. God provides it to us, and He says, "Here you are, you are all stewards." We don't have a choice in that. Our God is a giving God. He has given all to us, and He wants His people to learn how to be generous, too, and willing to share.

We are like the people in the parable of the talents. God gives us something to use for a while, and then finally He comes back, like the master in the parable, and He says, "Now give me an accounting. What have you done with what I have given you to use during your time on the face of the earth?" The Day of Judgment will be the day of accounting.
